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The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre (JPBC) located on Jerusalem's Mount of Olives, operates under the umbrella of the Arab Anglican Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East and under the supervision of the Archbishop and Chairman. It works in the fields of Health, Disability and Inclusive Education.

JPBC implements long-term community-based programs and has always maintained a clear vision of providing Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Inclusive Education through the Child Rehabilitation Centre and the Inclusive School. The JPBC Child Rehabilitation Centre has a long track record of quality service, and accordingly obtained the International Standard for a Quality Management System ISO9001:2008 in 2006, 2009 and 2012, then moved to the Joint Commission International Accreditation (JCIA) for Ambulatory Care, which is on a three-year cycle and has been achieved four times, in 2015, 2018, 2021 and recently 2024.

Through its Child Rehabilitation Centre, JPBC provides treatment and rehabilitation for Palestinian children with disabilities (CwD) from the West Bank, Gaza Strip and Jerusalem. The Centre receives CwD from birth till 15 years old.

Moreover, it is a member of the East Jerusalem Hospital Network, is the main referral Centre for the Palestinian Ministry of Health for treatment of Children with Disabilities and acts as a National Resource Centre for capacity building, clinical training, and dissemination of knowledge and best practices to practitioners and partner organizations. Our Inclusive School is a unique model of inclusive education serving children with disabilities from Jerusalem from Kindergarten up to 12th grade. Additionally, the school provides special education classes.

Our Vision:

All Palestinian children with disabilities have access to quality health services and inclusive education, can participate and influence, have hope and opportunities.

The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre, serving children since 1964, works for the integration and empowerment of CwD and their families in their communities by providing rehabilitation services, inclusive education, through the development and dissemination of best practices, and influencing policy and legislation.

We celebrated significant milestones, including the Centre's fourth consecutive JCIA accreditation, reflecting our continued adherence to international standards of quality and safety.

In 2024, 4164 children and their families benefited from our various programs, including the Mother and Family Empowerment Program, outreach services, and telemedicine. Moreover, we enhanced the infrastructure of our Inclusive School by adding new facilities to make it more accessible and accommodating for all learners.

Throughout this year, we stood firm in our calling: to respond to need with action, to hardship with resilience, and to uncertainty with faith. We are grateful to our board of directors, partners, donors, and community of supporters who make this work possible. Your solidarity strengthens our resolve and fuels our vision for a future where every Palestinian child with a disability can thrive.

The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre Receives JCIA Accreditation for the Fourth Consecutive Time



The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre (JPBC) has successfully received the Joint Commission International Accreditation (JCIA) for the fourth consecutive cycle, following a three-day evaluation process.

First accredited in 2015 and subsequently renewed in 2018 and 2021, this latest recognition in 2024 illustrates JPBC's continued commitment to delivering high-quality, Comprehensive Rehabilitation Services for Palestinian children with disabilities in East Jerusalem, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip, according to international standards and best practices in safety, quality, and continuous improvement.

His Beatitude Archbishop Hosam Naoum, Chair of the Board of Directors, praised the efforts of the Centre's professional and administrative staff, viewing the achievement as motivation to further advance service quality. General Director Mrs. Violette Mubarak reaffirmed JPBC's dedication to expanding its reach and maintaining excellence. Medical Director Dr. Waddah Malhees noted that the Centre received a higher evaluation score this year, reflecting the team's growing experience and continuous development.

This accreditation stands as international recognition of JPBC's leadership in the field of rehabilitation for children with disabilities in Palestine.

Heart to heart | the ministry of healing in the Gaza Strip during the turbulent times



At the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre, the commitment to comprehensive care is deeply rooted in collaboration and a shared vision. The Centre's multidisciplinary teams in Jerusalem and Gaza work hand in hand to ensure a seamless exchange of expertise and treat children with precision and care. This collaboration allows the team in Gaza to overcome unique challenges with the continuous support and guidance of their colleagues in Jerusalem.

The bonds between these teams go beyond purely professional connections. They share a common goal: to improve the quality and scope of rehabilitation services. This unity is critical to realizing the Centre's mission of transforming lives, one step at a time.

The Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre continued its commitment to children with disabilities in the Gaza Strip amidst ongoing conflict and hardship. With its holistic approach to care, the JPBC provided essential services such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and psychological support. These interventions not only helped to overcome physical and cognitive challenges, but also promoted emotional healing for the children and their families so that they can regain hope for their lives.

In 2024, the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre provided services through its unit located at the Al-Ahli Arab Hospital in the Gaza Strip to 527 children, offering Comprehensive Rehabilitation Services. In addition, our team operating in displacement areas extended services to 255 children living in those locations.

Altogether, a total of 8,117 therapy sessions were delivered to children with disabilities in Gaza, including physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and psychosocial support. As in Jerusalem, our team in Gaza operates under a comprehensive rehabilitation approach, ensuring holistic care for every child.

Expansion and Improvement of Services in the West Bank



At the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre, we continue our progress through the Outreach Program and strive to provide quality rehabilitation services for children with disabilities and their families. Our vision for 2024 has been centered on reaching the most marginalized and underserved areas, particularly the suburbs of Jerusalem (area J2), which have historically suffered from limited access to appropriate healthcare services.

Our efforts in these areas have achieved remarkable success. In 2024, for this new J2 area alone, a total of 225 children were assessed by our Outreach team, and 82 of these were referred to the Child Rehabilitation Centre at JPBC, to receive

comprehensive rehabilitation services, which is an important step towards improving their quality of life.

Through our Outreach Program, our team works tirelessly to engage families in the therapeutic process of their children. This is an essential part of our holistic vision of a better future for our children. This vision is embedded in the Mother and Family Empowerment Program, which we aim to make accessible to all of our children and their families, whether through our services at the Child Rehabilitation Centre or by emphasizing its importance to our partner centers' teams as a critical component to the development and growth of children with disabilities. In 2024, in the J2 area our multidisciplinary team provided workshops on the rights and needs of children with disabilities and the role of the parent, exceeding its original target of 120 parents by reaching 181 mothers and 76 fathers.

JPBC's General Director, Mrs. Violette Mubarak, Participated in AHCN Steering Group meeting in Hong Kong



As part of the International Anglican community, Mrs. Violette Mubarak, General Director of the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre (JPBC), participated in the Anglican Health & Community Network (AHCN) Steering Group meeting held in Hong Kong from October 13–15, 2024. Themed "Trust, Hope and Confidence: Equipping Anglicans in Health," the meeting aimed to enhance global collaboration among Anglican health institutions.

Representing JPBC and the wider Anglican healthcare presence in the Middle East, Mrs. Violette spoke about the distinct challenges facing health facilities in the region, particularly in the West Bank, Gaza

Strip, and Jerusalem. She advocated for the creation of a joint database to better coordinate resources across the Anglican Communion. During her visit, she also toured several key facilities supported by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council, including the Wong Tai Sin District Health Center and the Amy Cheung Aged Care Complex.



Comprehensive Therapy Services

At the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre, our Comprehensive Therapy Services are designed to support children with a wide range of physical, developmental, and emotional challenges. Through personalized care plans, we offer specialized therapies in the fields of physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and langaguge therapy, hydrotherapy, in addition to psychosocial support, all provided by our team of experienced professionals. These services help children improve their motor skills, enhance communication abilities, and develop emotional resilience, fostering their independence and confidence. By integrating therapies in a collaborative approach, we ensure that each child receives holistic care that addresses their unique needs, helping them to achieve their fullest potential and improve their quality of life.


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Child Development

The Child Development Services at the Princess Basma Centre provide comprehensive support to children with diverse developmental needs in the Jerusalem area. This program is designed for children facing a range of challenges, including developmental delays, cerebral palsy, autism spectrum disorder, speech and language delays, neurological impairments, and various syndromes. A multidisciplinary team of professionals including physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, psychologists, and social workers, work together to deliver holistic care that meets the individual needs of each child. Through personalized treatment plans, we aim to promote greater participation, growth, and integration for children, helping them thrive within their families and communities. The Child Development Services provided for children with disabilities from East Jerusalem is licensed within the Child Development Unit at the Centre.

500 In 2024, 500 children from the East Jerusalem benefited from 5,219 therapy sessions, through multiple admissions.

Student Therapy Services

Alongside our comprehensive array of services, JPBC extends rehabilitation services to children within our Inclusive School, ensuring that students with disabilities receive essential treatment and support. Our expert team addresses a diverse range of disabilities, including physical disabilities, visual impairments, hearing impairments, Down syndrome, autism, learning difficulties, and speech and language disorders. The therapeutic services encompass physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, hydrotherapy, sensory therapy, psychology, Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA), and other specialized therapies designed for children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. This holistic and multidisciplinary approach ensures that students receive personalized care that meets their developmental and educational needs, fostering an inclusive and supportive environment.




Therapy Sessions for Comprehensive Rehabilitation Services


Therapy Sessions for Child Development Services

Our Programs - Mother and Family Empowerment Program



Intensive Service Provision

The Mother and Family Empowerment Program at JPBC is an integral part of our therapeutic model, focusing on equipping families with the knowledge and skills necessary to support their children's development and well-being. Through workshops, hands-on training sessions, and personalized guidance, the program empowers mothers and family members to actively participate in the rehabilitation process.

This initiative fosters stronger family involvement, enhances the effectiveness of therapeutic interventions, and promotes a supportive home environment that reinforces the progress made during therapy sessions. By building the capacity of families, JPBC ensures that children receive consistent care and encouragement, contributing to their overall growth and integration into the community.


Our Programs-Outreach Program


The Outreach Program at the JPBC aims to expand essential rehabilitation services to children with disabilities in underserved areas lacking quality healthcare services. This program involves our multidisciplinary team assessing children and facilitating referrals to the Child Rehabilitation Centre at JPBC or other healthcare providers, ensuring they receive the necessary healthcare services. Our team organizes weekly visits to our outpatient clinics and partner centers across the West Bank and in the J2 area to assess children and refer them for urgent treatment.

Additionally, our multidisciplinary team works with the staff of partner centers to transfer knowledge and enhance the capabilities of local teams, aiming to improve the quality of services provided at local centers and ensure the use of best practices during the therapeutic process.

1494 CwD were assessed at partner centers across the West Bank by our multidisciplinary team.







586 CwD were assessed and examined by our Medical Director during 2024 through our clinics in Jerusalem, Ramallah and Nablus.

Our Programs - Follow Up Program

At the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre, the Telemedicine Program was developed to ensure continuity of care for children with disabilities after each discharge from the Child Rehabilitation Centre. Through this program, our multidisciplinary team conducts structured follow-up sessions with the children and their families, helping them track therapeutic goals and developmental milestones. These virtual sessions allow our specialists to evaluate the child's progress, address parents' questions and concerns, and collaboratively set new goals for continued rehabilitation at home. In addition to overcoming geographical and logistical barriers, the Telemedicine Program strengthens the family's role in the therapeutic journey and reinforces our commitment to holistic, family-centered care. In 2024 alone, over 122 families benefited from the program, highlighting its increasing importance amidst the ongoing challenges of movement and access restrictions across different areas.

Our Programs Clinical Training Program



As a leading National and Resource Centre, JPBC drives a specialized program designed to equip Palestinian university students with essential clinical training. Led by our experienced multidisciplinary team, this initiative is conducted in collaboration with number of Palestinian universities.

Targeting students in physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, and social work, the program provides a dynamic learning environment where theoretical knowledge is transformed into hands-on practice. Through direct interaction with patients and their families, students gain invaluable real-world experience, fostering both professional competence and compassionate care. By bridging the gap between academia and practice, this initiative nurtures the next generation of skilled healthcare professionals.

We are committed to ensuring that students with disabilities have access to quality education in an inclusive environment. We firmly believe that every child has the right to education, with a particular focus on empowering students with disabilities. We continuously strive to create equal opportunities that ultimately lead to the development of our students' skills and the achievement of their independence.

To achieve these goals, our inclusive school's educational services are designed based on the principles of inclusion, empowerment, and progress, while also providing rehabilitation services for students with disabilities.

417 During the 2023/2024 academic year, our inclusive school welcomed 417 students, including 272 males and 145 females. Among them, 146 students were children with disabilities, representing 30% of our total student body. Our classrooms are designed to include both inclusive education and special education classes, ensuring that each student receives services tailored to their individual needs.

Inclusive Education



The Princess Basma Inclusive School is committed to providing education for children with disabilities in an inclusive environment, where students with disabilities learn alongside their peers without disabilities in the same classrooms. We firmly believe that every child has the right to education, with a special focus on empowering children with disabilities and ensuring equal learning opportunities.

During the 2023/2024 academic year, a total of 361 students were enrolled in inclusive classrooms, including 90 students with disabilities. This approach ensures that children with disabilities can continue their educational journey, pursue higher education, and access broader academic and professional opportunities.

Special Education




In addition During the 2023/2024 academic year, our school operated six specialized classes tailored to meet the educational needs of 56 students with disabilities, including 41 males and 15 females. These classes serve as a foundational stage, preparing students for a smooth transition into inclusive classrooms. The admission process is guided by a multidisciplinary comprising special education teachers, regular teachers, and assistant teachers. Together, they develop and implement individualized education plans, ensuring appropriate accommodations and alternative learning strategies to support each student's needs. Our specialized classes cater to a wide range of disabilities, including physical disabilities, autism, hearing impairments, and learning difficulties.

Planned initiatives and objectives for 2025

Expanding of the Outreach Program



In response to growing needs across the West Bank, the Princess Basma Centre has been actively expanding its services, with a particular emphasis on strengthening its Outreach Program. By establishing deeper partnerships with intermediate level services and partner centers across the West Bank and J2 area and extending the reach of our multidisciplinary team, we are ensuring that children with disabilities receive specialized rehabilitation closer to their homes, while opening access for high quality services at our Centre in Jerusalem. This expansion reflects our commitment to accessibility, community empowerment, and continuity of care for

families who otherwise face logistical and financial barriers to essential services. Within this framework, the Centre has placed a special focus on supporting children on the autism spectrum by offering assessments, therapies, and family guidance, recognizing the urgent need for autism-specific services across underserved areas.

Heart to Heart: Sustaining Support for Gaza's Children

In the face of ongoing conflict and uncertainty, our commitment to Gaza remains unwavering. The Heart to Heart: From Jerusalem to Gaza program will continue as a vital bridge of support, ensuring children with disabilities receive follow-up care, therapy, and family guidance. Our teams in Gaza and Jerusalem work hand in hand, using best practices to deliver quality rehabilitation, and we are determined to strengthen and sustain this lifeline, no matter the challenges ahead.

Renovation of Two Playgrounds

This year, the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre completed the full renovation of two playgrounds to provide inclusive, safe, and engaging spaces for all children benefiting from its services, including children with physical disabilities. These renovations were designed to serve both therapeutic and recreational purposes, incorporating sensory-friendly equipment and safety-compliant flooring, as well as ensuring the availability of wheelchair-accessible areas. These upgrades are a direct reflection of our rehabilitation and inclusive education programs.

Training of a New Pediatric Rehabilitation Doctor

Recognizing the urgent need for specialists in the field of pediatric rehabilitation for children with disabilities, the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre is currently training a new doctor specializing in pediatric rehabilitation. This project is part of our investment in local capacity building and a key step to ensure the continuity and sustainability of services for children with disabilities, particularly those with complex and multiple conditions.
